Where an organisation has less than 5 levels, some first time competitors to BAA will have a choice of entry level.

Where a dog's eligibility in other organisations is by virtue of wins by handler or owners with another dog then its initial entry into BAA would be one level below the equivalent level. i.e Dogs that compete in KC Novice (prior to 1/1/2007) by virtue of owner/handlers wins with another dog may enter at BAA Primary level. KC Grades 3 & 5 have a choice of entry level to BAA.
